## **THE WILDERNESS HAS COME TO BOULDER CITY! UNIQUE WILDERNESS EXHIBIT AND PROGRAM AT BOULDER CITY LIBRARY**

### **Boulder City –**

November is wilderness month in Boulder City. A touring wilderness exhibit, developed in partnership with the Nevada State Museum, will be featured at the Boulder City Library during the month of November. The visually appealing and educational show, *"The Art of Nature: Images from the Wildlands of Southern Nevada,"* will be on display at the library that is located at 701 Adams Blvd in Boulder City.

The show provides an amazing opportunity for Boulder City residents and visitors to take a unique journey through the wildlands of Clark County by viewing a series of photographs, sketches, paintings and informational panels. In addition to the traveling show the Nevada State Museum has graciously provided additional specimens from their Natural History collections that will be on display in the main foyer of the library.

The artist featured in the show, Sharon K. Schafer, will present an entertaining multi-media program *The Art of Nature: Images from the Wildlands of Southern Nevada* at 7:00-8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov 3rd at the Boulder City Library. This program highlights her photographs, paintings, and drawings, and takes the viewer on a journey into wilderness areas of Clark County. "It is my hope the viewer will come away with a different perspective of Clark County," said Schafer. "The southern Nevada region is not a desert wasteland. It is home to unparalleled natural beauty in its landscape and great diversity in its wildlife," Schafer explained.

Sharon also will be educating and entertaining the students at Boulder City's Grace Christian, Martha P. King, and Garrett schools with multimedia assemblies designed to open young eyes to the beauty and diversity of the wildlands surrounding their home town.

In 2000, Schafer established Skydance Studio in an effort to combine her interest in art and nature.
